The ArtCube offers an opportunity to explore the next step of the Waste Project and look at the topic of wasted time and space to do nothing, the idea of wasting time, and is time a commodity – go hard go fast.

The bolsters that demanded a slow stitch approach using reuse zips, doonas, fabrics, gathering discarded waste items like a magpie. What occurred was the use of time. And what was wasted time. The urgency that exists in today's modern world. Is doing nothing Wasting time?

Join in: Keep an eye out for Tracie's A Waste of Time - Do Nothing sessions: led relaxation and deep breathing times each week remembering how to relax the brain and the body. Put down the phone, turn off the computer, switch off the brain. Come and waste time doing nothing.

While well known for her woven and constructed works, Mandy also uses old books, beach rope, inner tubes, and other found objects like echidna spines, plant materials, sand and rock.

Her work has been exhibited both in Australia and internationally.
